Penn Hospital receives donation of a wheelchair to mark The Queen's Diamond Jubilee Year

Cedar Ward at Penn Hospital, part of Black Country Partnership NHS Foundation Trust, recently took receipt of a brand new wheelchair, generously donated by Path to Success, as part of its celebration to mark The Queen's Diamond Jubilee Year.

The charity, Path to Success, has contributed to this momentous year of celebration by running the *60 for 60 Wheelchair* campaign to provide 60 wheelchairs for 60 NHS hospitals in England. Path to Success has been able to donate 60 wheelchairs since January 2012 and has raised funds for another 23 to be donated to NHS Hospitals by end of this year.

Rosa Chieza, Ward Manager, and Julie Grainger, Clinical Lead Occupational Therapist attended a presentation ceremony at the Heartlands Hospital in Birmingham, where a number of NHS organisations took receipt of their new wheelchairs.

Gillian Mobbs, Divisional Manager for older adults said, "We are extremely pleased and grateful to receive one of the 60 for 60 wheelchairs from Path to Success, and I know that our patients on Cedar ward will benefit greatly from this very generous donation".
